The Patriot Soccer Club (PSC) is a volunteer-based, 501(c)(3) non-profit organization whose mission is to create competitive soccer programs for the youth of Gray/New Gloucester.

What is its Purpose?

The purpose of the Patriot Soccer Club is to:

- a. Develop, promote, serve and administer the game of soccer in Gray/New Gloucester;
- b. Encourage, support and assist in the growth and development of competitive soccer programs in Gray/New Gloucester for soccer players of all ages, genders and abilities;
- c. Encourage, support and assist in the growth and development of soccer tournaments for teams of all ages, genders and playing abilities in Maine;
- d. Encourage, support and assist the participation of member players and teams in soccer tournaments and programs outside of Maine;
- e. Provide education, training and licensing opportunities for players, coaches and referees participating in the game of soccer in Gray/New Gloucester; and
- f. Do any and all other acts necessary or desirable in the furtherance of the foregoing purposes and for the good of soccer.

Registration Information:

Patriot Soccer Club will be accepting registrations for the Fall 2010 season in April/May 2010. Register now at www.patriotsoccerclub.org.

Costs:

The cost to participate is \$125.00 per child, \$100.00 for second, and \$75.00 for the third child. One-half of registration fee is due at time of registration; remaining balance due no later than July 31, 2010.

A limited number of scholarships are available based on financial need. See Financial Scholarships on page 2.

Player Expectations:

Players will train twice weekly for approximately 90 minutes per session, except U-13 or U-14 teams. Their number of practices depends on the number of players committed to school teams. All teams compete in games on the weekend. Approximately half the games are "away." Most games are within thirty minutes travel time of Gray.

The players also compete in the Cumberland Labor Day tournament, the Crossroads Challenge during Columbus Day weekend, as well as in a season-end tournament or festival.

Coaching Staff:

While our coaches are all volunteers, many of them have coached and/or refereed for years. Others have played at the high school or college levels. Each team is required to have two licensed coaches, and each coach is required to hold at least his or her USFF "E" license.

How are Teams Formed?

The PSC works diligently to field teams in each age bracket (U-9 to U-14) for both boys and girls. Teams are separated by gender and age, and play only like teams.

In the event of having multiple U-9, U-10 or U-11 teams; each team will be equal in overall skill – there will not be any differentiation. U-9, U-10 and U-11 teams play in "non-results" oriented games.

The U-12, U-13 & U-14 teams are competitive and players are selected based upon their skill level. The U-12, U-13, & U-14 teams play in "results oriented" games.

No age appropriate child will be bumped from a team by a younger, more skilled player. If necessary, "cuts" will be made if there are not enough players to field a team.

Refund Policy:

Players and/or parents completing the registration process to play for the Patriot Soccer Club constitutes a commitment to play for the club and the team on which the player is assigned.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure the club's viability to field teams without players seeking to "drop" from the club's pool of players after the registration cut-off date. Often, registration data dictates the decisions required to roster players to specific teams. When a player registers to play and teams are formed, then a player seeks to drop, it creates a tremendous amount of work to re-configure teams.

Players and/or parents will be eligible to receive a refund in the amount of 75% of the registration fee if their request is submitted and approved 30 days or more prior to the registration cut-off date.

Players and/or parents will be eligible to receive a refund in the amount of 50% of the registration fee if their request is submitted and approved 15 days or more prior to the registration cut-off date.

Registration refunds will not be available after the registration cut-off date of June 15, 2010.

Should an eligible player be dismissed from an approved team by the Patriot Soccer Club --due to roster limitations or due to the players' ability-- s/he will be entitled to a full refund if said decision takes place prior to the beginning of team training.

Why do we hold a tournament in our community?

The Patriot Soccer Club created this tournament in 2000 to raise much-needed funds as follows:

Team Uniforms

(Each Player receives a full uniform to use for the season)

Tournament Attendance

(To go away to a tournament would cost an additional \$300+ per team)

Player registration scholarships for current season

(All kids in Gray and New Gloucester should have the opportunity to play soccer at this level)

Field Equipment and Supplies

(Existing Goals, nets and flags used by teams; paint for lining fields)

E-License certification and training for all coaches

(We require all coaches who work with your child to be licensed)

College Scholarship offered to a graduating senior that played for PSC as a youth.

Sense of Pride and Community working with our neighbors

"Playing Up":

"Playing up" occurs when a child plays on a team older than the one defined by his/her date of birth as defined by SoccerMaine. The Patriot Soccer Club believes that it is generally preferable that children play within their own age group. This is especially important in the younger years as we implement a comprehensive training program that is both age and developmentally appropriate. The policy is designed more to maximize participation and support team viability. PSC retains the right to manage its player list to ensure fielding teams at each age bracket.

Patriot Soccer Club has a Zero Tolerance Policy

Parents and spectators are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner which is consistent with the ideals of the Patriot Soccer Club and not bring discredit upon the Club. The role that parents play in the life of a soccer player has a tremendous impact on their experience.

Parent Volunteer Opportunities:

Being a volunteer based organization, there are many opportunities to help. Each team needs to have a team administrator to distribute information to players and parents as well as distribute uniforms. The Club also needs help with its tournament. Each parent is asked to provide assistance whenever possible.

Financial Scholarships:

In order to qualify for a scholarship, a player's parent must submit a written request for the scholarship with their child's registration application. In addition to requesting consideration for either full or partial scholarship, this provides an overview of need sufficient to justify that need. In this regard, it is not normally required that a person submit financial records unless a challenge arises to the need and the parent wishes to contest denial of a scholarship request.
